A life course approach emphasises a temporal and social perspective, looking back across an individual's or a cohort's life experiences or across generations for clues to current patterns of health and disease, whilst recognising that both past and present experiences are shaped by the wider social, economic and cultural context.

Life course epidemiology investigates the long-term effects of physical and social exposures during gestation, childhood, adolescence, young adulthood and later adult life on health and disease risk in later life.¹²It also encompasses pathways (biological, behavioural and psychosocial) influencing the development of chronic diseases and operating across an individual's life course or across generations.
