Dental Trauma Basic Home Care. Oral hygiene is important after (and yes, even before) dental trauma. Soft Diet is recommended for the first ~10 days after injury. Pacifier or digit sucking should be restricted. If a tooth is extracted / avulsed, patients who suck pacifiers/fingers may require a spacer.

As 85% of all oral injuries are considered traumatic, they tend to occur unexpectedly and are often the result of unavoidable risk factors, such as falls, sports-related injuries and other ...
