EDIT: Metaphysical problems take the form of antinomies, dilemmas or undecidable questions. The solution would be to deny the fundamental reality of the distinction on which they are predicated. This results in a form of global compatabilism for which such problems cannot arise.

What are some examples of solved philosophical problems?
The trolley problem is a series of thought experiments in ethics and psychology, involving stylized ethical dilemmas of whether to sacrifice one person to save a larger number. Opinions on the ethics of each scenario turn out to be sensitive to details of the story that may seem immaterial to the abstract dilemma.
